

U.S. Farmers % of U.S. labor Force




In 2000 farmers were **1.7**% of U.S. population



- Public funding cut to Universities
 - State funding has declined 40.2% since 1980 (American Council on Education)
 - Agricultural Colleges hit disproportionately hard
 - How are Universities coping?
 - Deriving funding from tuition increases
 - Overhead on research grants
 - Hiring faculty that can obtain grants
 - Hiring faculty in areas were grants exist.









University of Wisconsin



- Farmers small and declining % of population
- State public funding for Universities rapidly decreasing
- Grants for production agriculture research generally supported by commodity groups
- Grants from Federal Government generally for basic and/or environmental research
- Many Universities not refilling forage workers positions as they become vacant
- Remaining forage workers talented, dedicated and very productive
